Food allergies

We have a large number of children with allergies and food intolerances. For this reason, we ask that under no circumstances are any food or drinks, including drinks cups sent into nursery in your child's book bags or rucksacks. We have water and milk freely available for all children throughout the day, and provide snacks, so there is no need to send drinks bottles or any food into nursery.

Please can we remind parents to let us know of any allergies or dietary needs your child has so that we can keep them safe and ensure we are providing the right food for your child. Please also speak to the office if this changes for your child.

Attendance

Attendance at school is really important and we will follow up on all absences. If you know your child will not be in for any reason, please call and let the office know dates of absence and reason. We will always ask the specific reason for absence, so that we can monitor any contagious or infectious illnesses that we need to let others know about. This is to safeguard everyone, so please do not be offended if we ask.

We follow all guidance from the NHS, Department for Education and UKHSA (UK Health Security Agency) for incubation periods and illnesses.

"It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above".

We would encourage all parents to read the following guidance from the NHS; NHS 'Is my child too ill for school?' guidance³

It is also our policy not to allow children to attend nursery if they have been given Calpol, Ibruprofen or similar over the counter medicine as this could mask symptoms and temperatures. We can also only administer prescription medicines. You will need to complete a form in the office if your child needs to be given prescription medicine. We require children to remain off nursery following episodes of vomiting and diarrhoea for 48 hours to avoid the spread of any illnesses.

Admissions for September 2025

We are currently processing our applications for September 2025. If your child is currently in our 2-3s Nursery, you will shortly be sent a form to complete regarding your session preference, morning/afternoon or 30 hours. You do not need to complete another application form. Please ensure this is completed by the admissions deadline of 15th January 2025.

If your child is due to start Primary School in September 2025, applications also have to be completed by the 15th January date. If you need any help to complete the application form, please do not hesitate to ask. For our families with children with high needs, do check with us if you need to complete a mainstream application or if your child will be admitted through the SEND route.

If you have a child born between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2023, or know someone born between those dates, do encourage them to apply for a place at Dorking Nursery School for a September 2025 start, again by the deadline of 15th January 2025.
