

Newsletter - May 2025

Dear Parents and Carers

May is now upon us and we are already half way to half term. I hope everyone had a wonderful long weekend.

With the warmer weather approaching, please do read the reminders below about our sun safety policy so that you can ensure your child is appropriately dressed and prepared for the weather. Please note the other reminders too:-

Term dates - Please note the holiday closures at the end of the term and Surrey term dates, to access these on Surrey County Council website - click here¹.

The last full nursery day (normal hours) is Tuesday 15th July. Wednesday 16th July is a **Stay and Play** fun day where we invite you to join your child for a shorter session. More details with specific timings will be shared later in the term.

Parking - Parking continues to be an issue, with parents and carers parking in the nursery car park without a valid permit or registered Blue Badge. This tends to happen more in the afternoon sessions. Please can I ask all families that do not have a permit not to park in our school car park or in our neighbours' spaces and respect the limited spaces we have for our families who need it.

Your key person - If at any time you need to talk to your child's key person, or a member of staff, do let us know. However, please note, your child's key person may not be able to talk to you at drop off and pick up, as they are in ratios and with the children, but we can make arrangements for a mutually convenient time. Alternatively, email the office admin@dorking.surrey.sch.uk or call us on 01306 882397 and leave a message for the member of staff.

Termly donation - you may have seen a £10 termly donation on your School Money account. This is a voluntary contribution to enable to us to provide enhancements to our curriculum. This includes all breakfasts and snacks, Woodland and Forest School snacks, resources to make playdough and other sensory activities and much more. If you are able to make this donation, we are really grateful.

Fees for lunches and extended/additional sessions - please ensure accounts and payments are up to date at any time. As per the terms and conditions, we ask for payment in advance of any sessions taken as we have to ensure the appropriate staffing is in place and order meals in advance.

Bringing items to nursery - we continue to have some children who have food or other items in their bags, such as lip balms. These should not be bought into nursery at any time.

Gate Safety - please ensure the black gate is closed as you pass through it, on a number of occasions it has been left open, which is not safe.

Collection at the end of the session - please note that staff will not send children to their parents at home time if they are on their mobile phones, either talking or scrolling on the screen. If that is the case, you will be asked to put your telephone away prior to your child being sent to you. There are also a considerable amount of parents who are late to collect their child,

again this tends to happen more in the afternoon session. The local primary schools all finish earlier than our 3.30pm finish to enable parents to make two pick ups, please ensure you are arriving on time to collect your child.

Tapestry - If you have not done so already, do check your Tapestry account regularly. This is a great way to see what your child is interested in at nursery and to spark up a conversation with them about their learning.

It is wonderful to know that parents have seen the posts, so please do this by either commenting on the post or 'liking' it with the 'thumbs up'. Please feel free to add photos from home too! We love to see them. Your next update should be posted by the end of the month!

Attendance - Attendance at school is really important and we will follow up on all absences. If you know your child will not be in for any reason, please call and let the office know dates of absence and reason. We will always ask the specific reason for absence, so that we can monitor any contagious or infectious illnesses that we need to let others know about. This is to safeguard everyone, so please do not be offended if we ask.

We follow all guidance from the NHS, Department for Education and UKHSA (UK Health Security Agency) for incubation periods and illnesses.

"It is usually appropriate for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild respiratory illnesses. This would include general cold symptoms: a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However, children should not be sent to school if they have a temperature of 38°C or above".

It is also our policy not to allow children to attend nursery if they have been given Calpol, Ibuprofen or similar over-the-counter medicine as this could mask symptoms and temperatures. We can also only administer prescription medicines. You will need to complete a form in the office if your child needs to be given prescription medicine. We require children to remain off nursery following episodes of vomiting and diarrhoea for 48 hours to avoid the spread of any illnesses.

VE Day - Thursday 8th May

This Thursday is the 80th Anniversary of VE Day. This is being celebrated widely in Dorking at the weekend with lots of local events. The second world war holds a special place in the history of Dorking Nursery School, as our school opened on the 3rd October 1939 to support evacuated children from London during the war. The aim was to provide respite to host families, but to most importantly provide a sense of normality in a time of huge unrest.

We will be putting up our Union Jack bunting this week and doing a range of Red, White and Blue activities. Staff will be dressed in these colours and your child is welcome to also.



Sun Safety

Please familiarise yourself with our sun safety policy and 'do's' and 'don't's:-

- Apply suncream prior to attending nursery
- If your child attends all day or does extended days, send a bottle of suncream into nursery that can be left onsite.
- Children must wear hats outside, please ensure this is named if your provide one for your child.
- No sunglasses, except prescription sunglasses.
- Shoes/footwear must be suitable for climbing and running. Sandals, open toes, sling backs, straps, crocs are not permitted. Trainers are ideal.
- Tops must cover shoulders strappy spaghetti straps do not provide suitable protection.

Dorking Nursery School Admissions for September 2025

We are processing our applications for September 2025. If your child attends now, we will shortly be sending you more information about the next steps, visits, and start dates for September, so do look out for this email when it comes. There will also be a meeting for the current families who are moving from the 2-3s to the 3-5s in September. This takes place on Thursday 15th May at either 9.00am or 12.45pm.

We have a few remaining places for September, if you know someone born between 1st September 2021 and 31st August 2023, do encourage them to apply for a place at Dorking

Nursery School for a September 2025 start. Application forms can be completed online using the link here.³

If your child is due to start Primary School in September 2025

If your child is due to start in a primary school in September 2025, please make sure we have the name of the school you have accepted. This is so that we can ensure that information is securely passed over and for key people to liaise with primary teachers. If you have not already told us where your child is going, please complete the form link here⁴.

Working entitlement funding codes

If you are accessing a working entitlement place with us now or in the future, your code needs to be checked and renewed each term. If you have had a reminder from the Government, please do this as soon as possible and let us know, it is your responsibility to do this. We cannot fund any places if codes are checked after the start of a term.



1 - Early Bird parent programme

Early Bird Programme

In the last letter, I shared with you that two of our staff, Lisa and Nicole had recently undertaken three days of intensive training to become licensed Early Bird trainers. This means that we can deliver and run the Early Bird Parenting Programme from the National Autistic Society which supports parents who have young children with additional needs or with a pending diagnosis. This is a 10 week programme started last week, supporting the first group of families.


